Assessment and Certification

Assessment takes place on day 2 of the course on Moulage, Radio Procedure and Triage, followed by a final MCQ. Certification of the course is valid for 4 years which includes continuous access to the VLE during this period.

Re-certification is required after 4 years by 1 of the following 3 options:

- Completing a full MIMMS Course.
- Attending during the testing stations on a course.
- Attending an ALSG approved 1 day recertification course (where available).

Instructors

Those who perform outstandingly well on an MIMMS course and, in the view of the course faculty, show potential as future instructors, may be offered the opportunity of attending a Generic Instructor Course (GIC).
